- A collaborative project documenting Acadian families (1600–1763)
- One shared profile per person, all trees are shared
- Built on reliable sources and transparent research

Why Researchers Use It

- Documented deportation ship lists and censuses
- Clear handling of conflicting evidence
- Research Notes for unresolved questions
- Unique DNA tools within a single shared tree to identify linkages

Getting Started on WikiTree

1. Register for a free WikiTree account as a Guest
2. Explore existing Acadian profiles (use the search boxes on any page)
3. Upgrade to Family Member to communicate
4. Sign the Honor Code to edit profiles or add to your family tree
5. Add sources or corrections where appropriate
6. Use Comments and Research Notes for theories or questions
7. Join the Acadians Project Google Group:

8. If you would like an Acadians Project badge, identify an area where you would like to contribute and contact us to get started

For Yourself

1. Make your Profile
2. Add your parents and grandparents until you connect with an existing ancestor
3. Search for older ancestors before making their profile
4. Add your DNA test to see relationships (see Help Pages)
5. You may import GEDCOM's carefully (see Help pages)
6. Explore tools using links at top of your profile
7. Ask for help on any Acadian profile in comments section
8. Ask for help on the G2G Forum (tech, general, sources, profiles)
9. Use Categories to find connections
10. WikiTree learning curve: patience, ask questions of any of us
